Teck was a pioneer engineer in NEC Hiroshima Japan and has 20+ years' experience in the semiconductor industry. He earned a MS degree in Design Engineering (Robotic Automation) from the University of Hiroshima.

The first atomic bomb, and the world's most deadly, blast Hiroshima in 1945. The explosion wiped out the entire city and killed 80,000 individuals. One of the few remnants withstood the explosion and became the Atomic Dome Museum in the Peace Park.
